Answer: "They are omnivores and mainly eat berries, fruits, nuts, and insects; occasionally they will catch fish or small mammals."

Trivia Question: "The Acadian Flycatcher is known for its distinctive call. What does it sound like?"



Answer: "Its call is a sharp 'peet-sah' or 'kleep,' often repeated every few seconds."





Trivia Question: "Moose are the largest of the deer family. How can you tell the difference between a male and a female?"

Answer: "Males have large, palmate antlers, while females do not have antlers."

Trivia Question: "Bald Eagles are a symbol of America. What is significant about their presence in Acadia National Park?"

Answer: "Their resurgence in the park is a conservation success story, as they were once near extinction due to DDT and other factors."

Answer: "Its dense matting helps to prevent soil erosion and provides habitat for small animals and insects."

Trivia Question: "Blue Mussels are common in Acadia. How do they filter feed?"

Answer: "They filter plankton and other small particles from the water using their gills."
