1:00 PM - 2:15 PM: Literacy Project (Memoirs)

 Educators participate in a literacy exercise, reading and discussing memoirs from the Pullman era. They will then write their own short memoirs or diary entries, imagining life during that period.

2:30 PM - 3:00 PM: Art Activity (Graffiti)

 Educators actively create graffiti art pieces reflecting the themes and struggles of the Pullman era, connecting historical and contemporary social issues through artistic expression.

3:00 PM - 3:30 PM: Music of the Pullman Era

 Educators will explore the music that was popular during the Pullman era, including folk songs, early jazz, and blues. This session will involve listening to recordings, discussing the cultural and historical context of these music genres, and participating in hands-on activities like trying to recreate or reinterpret some of the tunes.
